The History...

Debbie Bressette invited Dr. Linda Ornelas Wilson as a new BCC board member to attend an October meeting of a new 5 county Coalition for breast cancer awareness, screening and prevention at UT Dell Med. which was co-sponsored by AARO (Austin Area Research Organization). I was immediately drawn to the effort which included hospital systems, foundations, educational institutions, and leading care providers in the 5 county region and regional leaders from every county.

I was diagnosed with breast cancer in October of 2013 with stage 2B cancer with lymph node involvement. I was late in getting my mammogram. One in 5 women diagnosed with me with similar staging are no longer alive. As a *retired physician* I believed I could be an advocate for regular mammograms and join the effort. I was invited to join the Steering Committee which I accepted.



The goals and values of the coalition which came to be known as

Addressing Cancer Together
mirrored those of
Bastrop County Cares

An invitation was extended by ACT
Steering Committee which was
accepted. This remarkable group had
the support of the Med School and the
AARO health committee at every stage
of planning. The need to reach outlying
counties without a Hospital Authority
was on the agenda.



Statistics

There are some unique statistics for cancer in the Austin Regional area that spurred this work.

- 1) Cancer is the number one cause of death in Central Texas
- 2) Only 39% of women in Bastrop County were getting mammograms compared to approx 70% +state wide.
- 3)If you are uninsured in Texas and get breast cancer your mortality rate almost doubles.
- 4) In spite of overall reductions in mortality African American women have a higher death rate.
- 5) Hispanic women are diagnosed at later stages.
- 6) Stage 1 breast cancer patients have 98% 5 year survival rate. Stage 4 patients have a 26% 5 year survival rate. Stage 1 breast cancer patients have 98% 5 year survival rate.



Given the need for mammograms in Bastrop County a breast coalition was built. Inclusion was always the way we attempted to increase screening in the uninsured women or underinsured women. One of the first we invited was Marva Overton who has been a champion of outreach to the uninsured and women of color in the county. With the help of Marva Overton, Dr. Noel and Krystal Grimes a focus group was conducted in Bastrop County. From their collective ideas regarding the importance of outreach and building trust in the underserved communities, the Bastrop County Council was born. The council worked collaboratively with AAAHCT- Alliance for African American Health in Central Texas, Executive Director, Marva E. Overton, Introducing Ms. Overton.

So what about the Pinky Promise?

ACT was supportive of a campaign called the *Pinky Promise*.

- Bastrop County was chosen to be the pilot campaign.
- Shivers Cancer Foundation and ACT supported the efforts to increase screening in uninsured women.
- During COVID epidemic, continued mammograms was one of the casualties.
- A goal was created to reach 50 women who needed screening.
- Lydia Perez from Community Action was instrumental in this task and became a treasure to the region, especially to Bastrop County.
- Support from Marva Overton, BCC Council, the federally qualified health clinics, the Methodist Ministries, Smithville Free Clinic, Seton Smithville and Bastrop County Cares the work began...
- The team received an extension of the time frame due to COVID which allowed us to reach over 150 women who entered under the guidelines of the *Pinky Promise*.

The dedication of this group we now call the Bastrop County Cares Breast Initiative is humbling.

Where are we now?

The ACT coalition continued to design an actual pathway for care of these women who did not have insurance and were not from Travis County. This pathway was made possible by the collaboration of multiple healthcare providers, foundations, healthcare systems as well as providers and volunteers.

The Big Pink Bus was returned to the region to provide mobile mammography, but the fixed mammography providers continue to be essential to increase screening in Bastop County to 70% of the eligible population of women.

ACT in order to accomplish this amazing feat invited United Way to become the Backbone organization . We are now operating as ACT/UW under the leadership of Ellen Richards. This pathway also relied on the Bastrop County Commissioners Court to help fund Bastrop County women. The other counties in the region have also participated. Our cities have supported our efforts as well. Introducing Ellen Richards.

Now women are able to be screened and actually treated regardless of their ability to obtain insurance. *The Pinky Promise is back.* The whole idea of the Pinky Promise is for all of us to to engage with each other to remind our family and friends to get screened. Talk about it. Someone may need to hear your words. We continue to advance educational opportunities and outreach. The community has supported the awareness of Breast Cancer and screening by sponsoring events or raising money that allows us to continue the outreach, inclusion and education of the underserved in Bastrop County. The generosity of time, promotion of events and support of these events is what makes Bastrop County so special. 
